REGIONAL PROGRAMME AT THE EUROPEAN DEVELOPMENT DAYS FORUM IN BRUSSELS

The European Union (EU) and UN Women will showcase the joint regional programme "Implementing Norms, Changing Minds" to end violence against women in the Western Balkans and Turkey at the European Development Days (EDD) Forum 2018.

The event, to be held in Brussels on 5 and 6 June 2018, focuses on the theme 'Women and Girls at the Forefront of Sustainable Development: Protect, empower, invest'.

The three-year EU-UN Women programme, financed by the European Commission to the

tune of five million euros, is working with women's organizations in the Western Balkans and Turkey to prevent and respond to violence against women, and to advance the implementation of the Istanbul Convention.

The EDD forum is expected to bring together governments, international organizations, civil society groups, donors, private sector organizations and individual development players to discuss gender equality and the empowerment of women and girls.
