










The United Nations initiative 'Youth 4 Inclusion, Equality and Trust' aims at empowering young people to engage in constructive narratives, strengthen intercultural dialogue, inclusion, and gender equality, and create mutual understanding and trust in the Western Balkans region. The "Voices of Youth" regional research, implemented by UN Women and co-designed, conducted and developed by five young researchers from Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina (BiH), Kosovo*, North Macedonia, and Serbia, aims at exploring the linkages between youth development, gender equality, and social cohesion challenges in the region.

What do young people in Western Balkans think about gender equality?



Almost 7/10 recognise absence of **gender equality**.



More than a half believe
discrimination & gender-based
violence negatively affects their
well-being.



Almost 70% strongly believe that **hate speech** divide us.



8/10 highlight negatively the influence of **cultural norms** over gender stereotypes.

UN WOMEN "IMAGINE" CAMPAIGN! Imagine Changing this Reality...

UN Women conducted a regional online media campaign titled "Imagine Campaign" from January to April 2024. The campaign emphasized the positive influence of gender equality and fact-based narratives on social cohesion, while shedding light on the adverse effects of gender disparities. This campaign involved young journalists, musicians and artists, civil society activists, and influencers from the Western Balkans region.

Instead of conflicts imagine hugs




Instead of exclusion imagine solidarity


